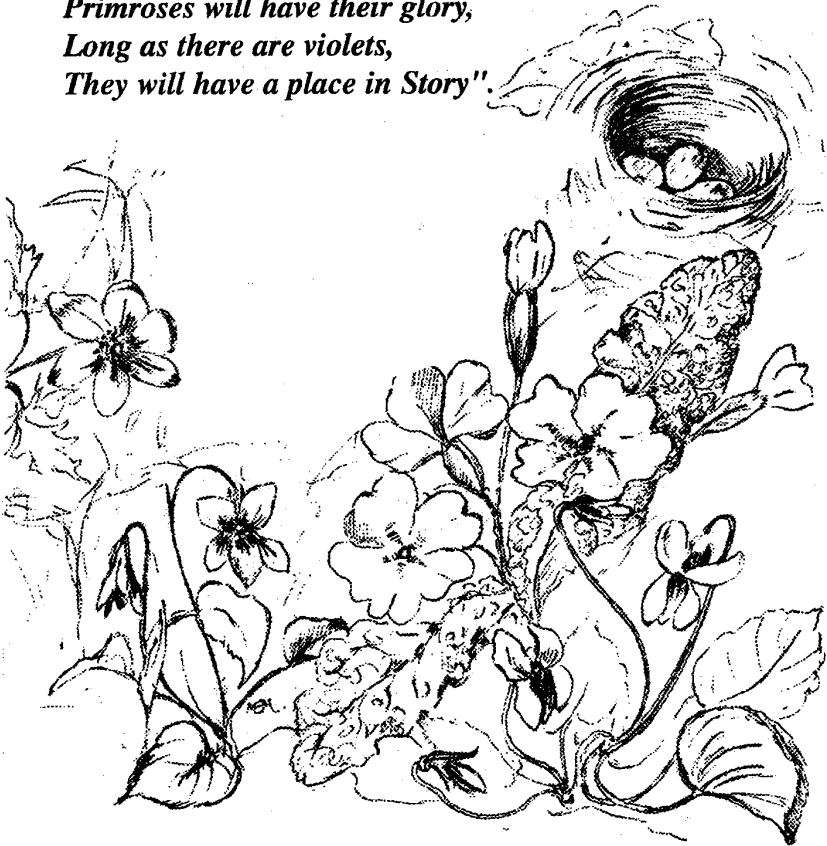

PILTON VILLAGE HISTORY GROUP ~ ALL WELCOME!

'The Early Days of Stereo Photography'

Monday 14th March at 7.30pm prompt
Club Room of Pilton Village Hall



Ian Sumner will be giving a talk (postponed from January) about the early days of stereo photography with particular reference to T. R. Williams (1824 -

1871). Stereo cards became popular in the 1850s. Williams was an early practitioner and in the mid-1850s completed a series of pictures of a small village in Berkshire (in many ways similar in size and rural nature to Pilton 150 years ago).

In 2009 Queen guitarist and 3D fanatic Brian May published a book entitled 'A Village Lost and Found', which includes illustrations of every study taken in the village by Williams. It also reveals how Dr May discovered the previously unknown location of the village, and Williams' unusual working methods.

Ian will illustrate the talk with the aid of the book and Brian's website, along with an 1860s brass and mahogany stereo viewer and some examples from his own small collection of stereo views.

Ian has been a photographer for fifty years and has lived in Pilton for thirty years.

Puffin Crossing Update - A Task Order has now been issued to the contractors to undertake the construction works for the Small Improvement Scheme in Pilton. The completed scheme design can be seen at www.somerset.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/small-improvement-schemes-directory (look for 'TI004358 – A361 Pilton (pedestrian crossing improvements)' in Mendip district. There is not yet a programmed start date for the construction works.

In the meantime, there will be an advanced vegetation cut prior to the main scheme works, so that this can be completed before the spring nesting season to minimize any impact on wildlife.

PHOTOCOPYING AND SCANNING IN PILTON

Pilton Duplicating Service was set up in 1982, using unexpected profits from the Royal Wedding Celebrations, to provide copying, on a non-profit basis, for villagers and village organisations. It is NOT a business but is run as a voluntary service.

We originally had a Roneo Duplicator (hence the name) but have progressed a lot since then, and can now copy in black and white, or in colour, up to A3 paper in size.

We hold stocks of A4 white and coloured paper and A3 white paper.

We also have stock of A4 card white or coloured.

We can also scan to a memory stick and print from a memory stick or other formats.

CHANGES TO THE HIGHWAY CODE

which will affect all road users when meeting horses on our roads from January 1st.

GUIDANCE stating that horses should be passed at a **maximum of 10mph** and at a minimum of **two metres' distance** are among the "significant" improvements in proposed changes to the Highway Code. Also, cyclists must not pass riders on the inside and should call out when approaching or passing horses to alert the rider.

Head cams are recommended for all riders to record non-compliance. A big thank you to all the drivers who already take care when passing horses. Your informed actions and consideration will have avoided a potential accident and are greatly appreciated by all equestrians.

PILTON VILLAGE HISTORY GROUP “MORE PILTON PEOPLE” BOOK

Plans are moving forward on this, to prepare additional pages for September publication, marking the decade 2012-22 since the first edition of *Pilton People*. There have, alas, been many farewells but also many new villagers to welcome. The idea, as before, is that it should be “in their own words (mostly)” with linking texts.
