RECTOR'S RAMBLES

May has been a very musical month, from the concert after the Coronation to Eurovision and this month we will have Glastonbury Festival, followed by the annual Prom concerts next month. Some new music and some more familiar.

As a lover of all kinds of music, I find it particularly fascinating how our brain can often immediately remember lyrics of songs, or tunes we haven't heard for years, whereas we can regularly forget things like our computer passwords. It is not just that we remember them, but we can hear the artist or the orchestra in our heads, our brains really are amazing. So, I did a bit of reading up as to why we can recall songs in so much detail. Studies appear to have concluded that there are a few reasons. Firstly, music is linked to emotions and that makes it easier to recall. Secondly, if we like a particular piece of music, we tend to listen to it over and over again. Finally, listening to music is something that gives many of us pleasure and can release endorphins, unlike trying to recall a computer password which just releases frustration. Maybe that is the key, and we should set all our passwords to music!

I wonder what your favourite type of music is. I must admit to a very eclectic music taste, from classical to rock, and most things in between. You will also be unsurprised to know I love religious music in its many different forms. From choral evensong, when it is as if the music rises up and out of the church/cathedral to God, to listening to vocal renditions of the psalms, it can lift my moods and help me worship God.

The psalms are fascinating – they would have been learned as part of the oral tradition to be sung and repeated over and over again. There really is a psalm for every occasion, some are sad, some happy or celebratory, others are really, really angry. Thousands of years ago it appears that people learned that it was good to express emotions individually and corporately by singing psalms. Maybe we all need to recapture that ability, maybe that is what music does for many of us.

Whatever your musical taste, I hope you will find some music which inspires and moves you, and helps you express how you feel. Or some that you can sing along to at the top of your voice.

CROSCOMBE SENIOR CITIZENS' CLUB

For our April meeting, we had a talk on Medical Detection dogs, ones that seem to know when someone has a bad illness.

How did it start? It was set up in Buckinghamshire in 2007, when a dog discovered an illness, breast cancer, in a lady called Daisy.

We were shown a video explaining how dogs are trained. It takes about 2 years to train a puppy, and costs around £29,000. They use all kinds of dogs, large and small, that stay with incredible volunteers. The training is based on the dog's nose which has 300,000,000 sensory receptors to our 5,000,000 and are trained to home in on a particular smell.

All dogs have normal lives living in loving homes and our Queen Camilla is the patron.

It was a very interesting talk but I was just a little disappointed that so few people turned up to listen. Thank you to those who did.
