

RECTOR'S RAMBLES

Lately I have been thinking a lot about the natural rhythm of life. Partly prompted by the number of funerals which have been happening in our Benefice recently, but also because it seems far too easy to dwell on the negative aspects of modern life and not the positive.

We all know that death is part of life, whether we are talking about people or even organisations, but we also know it is hard.

Winston Churchill said this: "Let us be contented with what has happened to us and thankful for all we have been spared. Let us accept the natural order in which we move. Let us reconcile ourselves to the mysterious rhythm of our destinies, such as they must be in this world of space and time. Let us treasure our joys but not bewail our sorrows. The glory of light cannot exist without its shadows. Life is a whole, and good and ill must be accepted together. The journey has been enjoyable and well worth making- once."

I find that a really helpful reminder that, whether we are talking about a person or an organisation, beginnings and endings are a natural part of life as are the associated highs and lows we experience. The question is how do we cope with those highs and lows. Churchill's answer to celebrate and treasure the highs and accept the lows seems pretty good advice to me.

There is a verse from Philippians which encourages us to focus on the positive which I think agrees with what Churchill is saying:

"Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." (*Philippians 4:8*)

It strikes me that the more time we spend thinking about the positive things the more resilient we might be when life throws us curved balls. But sometimes despite our best efforts we find ourselves struggling, and that is when we can reach out for help and support.

We have wonderful communities in our villages and many people who support each other at times of trouble, and are also happy to celebrate the positive times. So, as we experience the natural rhythms of life, let us continue to support each other during the good times and the bad. And thinking about celebrating the positive, maybe that is something we could encourage the news cycle to adopt.



PILTON VILLAGE HISTORY GROUP Monday July 10th at 7.30pm in Pilton Village Hall

Chris Eldridge will be giving us his highly recommended, illustrated talk on "Alfred the Great".

'England as we know it today was created by Alfred the Great. It was born of an extraordinary crisis in the year 878 when Alfred went from a fugitive in the marshes to a victorious king in just six months. Most of the events happened within a thirty-mile radius of Pilton, from Athelney in the west to Edington in the east. Alfred's actions during those few desperate months are the reason he is the only English king to be remembered as 'the Great'.

'Chris Eldridge is originally from Cheshire and studied history at Magdalene College, Cambridge. He is currently Head of History at Wells Cathedral School, founded by Alfred the Great's son Edward the Elder in 909. He was recently appointed a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society for his work promoting early medieval history in secondary education.'

It should be a real treat to hear his talk, and will round off our very interesting and very much enjoyed 2022-2023 season, which has seen 366 attendances to our events in that time!

Everyone, members or visitors alike, is welcome to this last meeting before we have a break during August.
