

At our July meeting we had Jim Scott, telling us how he became involved with helping others in times of crisis.

He started by telling us he had an addiction to travel, joined the Merchant Navy, left at 22, decided to travel for six months, only to return after 42 years, some journey.

He visited the Virgin Islands where he realised that the houses made of wood were not very sturdy in times of hurricanes, although cheap to repair. In such desperate times, people needed much assistance and so he set up a charity to help victims. The most help needed was money and he managed to raise \$600,000 in his little office. He would go for two weeks to areas to see where the money was most needed.

Jim then joined REACT, a charity providing humanitarian aid where it is most needed, He was properly trained to also assist residents. Volunteers are a mix of ex-military and civilians, and work in units of four (one being a medic). Not being government funded, they can remain neutral.

This talk was most interesting, and many questions were asked after the talk. Thank you, Jim, you helped make a very enjoyable afternoon.
