

A UNIQUE STORY

When I speak to my Mum on my birthday, she often recalls to me the events that surrounded my arrival in the world. These include nearly being born in the hospital lift, my older brother being smuggled in to see me under my Dad's overcoat and of various aunts sneaking onto the maternity ward out of visiting hours by wearing their WRVS uniforms.

Each of us has a unique story about our birth. At Christmas we'll be recounting once again the story that we share about another birth - the birth of Jesus. Across the world we'll be re-telling and re-enacting what happened in Bethlehem more than 2000 years ago. We'll recall the journey of Mary and Joseph, the birth in the stable, the arrival of the shepherds, the song of the angels, the visit of the Magi.

Our own birth stories are unique to each of us. Jesus's is common to us all. And not just because we all know about it. For in our recollection of Jesus's birth, we'll also be remembering that in him, God came to be at one with us. In Jesus God arrived to share fully in our humanity, experiencing complete solidarity with every aspect of our human condition. Jesus is 'God with us' – in trenches in Ukraine, bomb shelters in Israel and Gaza, in hospital wards where loved ones die, in relationships where there is conflict and distress.

Just as much as he is with us in our greatest joys and our deepest woes, Jesus is also for us. One of the earliest teachers of the Church said this: 'He became what we are so that we might become what he is.' The baby born in Bethlehem stands with us not only in all that we experience. This child also comes to offer us the possibility of opening every part of our lives to the transforming power of God's life of love and joy and peace. He comes so that every day we can become a little more like him.

This is the good news of Christmas and may it be yours this year.

"Folk Carols of the West Country - folk carols and winter traditions."

Yvette is a Visiting Research Fellow at Bournemouth University; she researches folk song and works with community choirs across the UK and internationally.

"During research into the collecting journeys of Cecil Sharp in Somerset, I became interested in some of the local carols and traditions he recorded. My motivation when seeking out carols and midwinter songs was that I was looking for material for my choirs to sing at Christmas concerts. This led to many research journeys and discoveries. A particularly interesting feature of community singing in the area occurs in a church context. 'West Gallery Singing' is a wonderful archival collection of hymns and carols, composed locally, for harmony singing by church quires that incorporated both singers and musicians, sometimes with locally-made instruments and oddities such as the serpent."

Chris King gave us a fascinating talk on Annie Naish. Annie took photographs in the early 20th century using glass plates. She recorded rural life with wonderful photos showing agricultural and domestic practices of the time. Chris initially found some of Annie's pictures as postcards and then discovered this early female photographer lived a few miles from Pilton all her life. Annie was the mother of Harold and Frank Naish who made cider at Piltown Farm for many years.

In November, we welcomed Philip and Gill Eavis with their annual video show of Pilton events. The first film was 40 years old and featured John Howe and Margaret Windsor as Jack and Bill. The script was brilliant and the performance, in broad Somerset, was hilarious. It was a personal delight to see my mother and being reminded of how entertaining she was. We watched the celebrations at the Tithe Barn for the Queen's 70th Jubilee and the Pilton Players entertainments for the Coronation of King Charles. We had the largest attendance at Happy Circle for a long time. We are so fortunate that Philip records these events for posterity. Please keep it up and come back next year!
