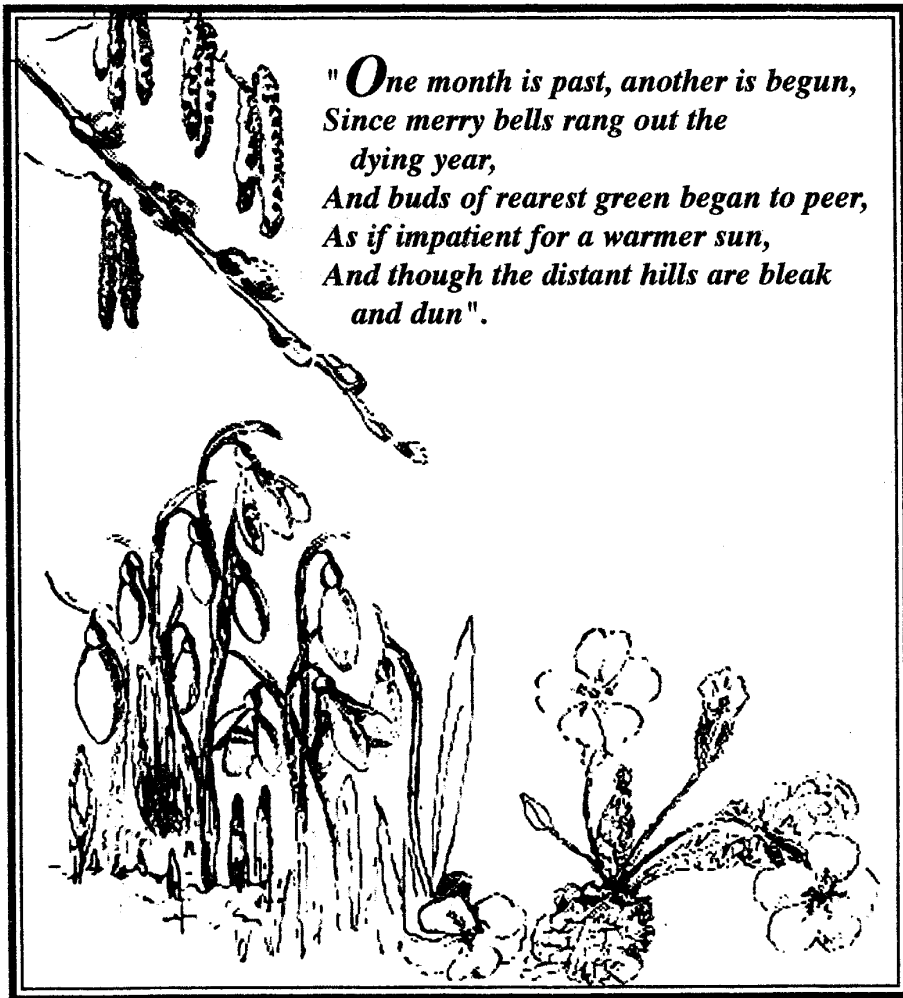

CHANGING TIMES

The Church of England is in the process of making changes in the groupings of parishes and the number of ordained priests serving in parish ministry. This involves our own diocese of Bath and Wells.

Following the move of Revd Christine Butler as Rector of Pilton with Croscombe, North Wootton and Dinder to the Chipping Sodbury Benefice, there will be changes here too.

Our four parishes have worked together under the leadership of four priests. This began 43 years ago in 1980. It will be a big change for all of us but especially for Dinder and Croscombe who joined together in 1972. It is also over twenty-five years since Dulcote joined with Dinder.

Since September last year, representatives from Pilton, Croscombe and North Wootton have been working with representatives from the Fosse Trinity Benefice (made up of Ditchheat with Alhampton, East Pennard and Pylle) to write the Parish Profile for the proposed new benefice. There are copies of the Profile in the churches. This was a considerable amount of work and we are very grateful for the work undertaken on our behalf.

The post for our future incumbent has been advertised and it is hoped to hold interviews on February 19th and 20th. There will still be a gap of at least three months before a new priest is in post.

However, one change is coming before that:

St Michael and All Angels Parish of Dinder and Dulcote will become part of the Wells St Thomas Group on 1st April.

We want to celebrate our time together and will be doing this at
**the final Benefice Service of Holy Communion in Dinder
on Sunday 3rd March at 10.30am
Acting Archdeacon Charlie Peer will lead the service.**

This will be followed by a Bring-and-Share Lunch in the Village Hall. Jane Thorne has arranged for the Hall to be open from 10.15am in order to leave food before the service.

Do come along to the service and to the lunch afterwards as we celebrate so many friendships and events that we have enjoyed together.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is on 14th February this year. This is the traditional start of Lent, the season leading up to Easter. In the Benefice there will be a Communion Service in North Wootton at 7.30 pm, which will include the opportunity for 'ashing' for those who wish to do so. This is an ancient tradition when ashes are made out of last year's palm crosses and the sign of the cross is made on people's foreheads. It is a symbolic reminder of our need for God's forgiveness in our lives.

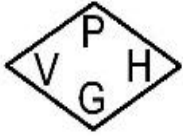

PILTON VILLAGE HISTORY GROUP

***"Pilton's Lost Tithe Barn"** – An illustrated talk by Richard Raynsford*
Richard has lived in Pilton for over thirty years and has always had an interest in local history - particularly old maps and historic buildings. He worked for a number of years as a planning officer with Mendip District Council and was also a conservation officer.

*For a brief period, he was a trustee of the Pilton Barn Trust and welcomed the restoration of the building from a roofless ruin. The barn was built by the monks of Glastonbury Abbey to store produce from their estate at Pilton - **it was never a tithe barn.***

Farming was carried out by tenants of the abbey who were allocated strips of land in large open fields, fragments of these fields still exist. The tenants had to give a tenth of their produce to the Parish Church, this was stored in the tithe barn with revenue from the sale of the produce being used to maintain the church.

The system continued when land was sold to private owners after the dissolution of the abbeys, but was resented by some of these, particularly if they were not worshippers at the parish church. The practice continued however, until the early twentieth century.

The site of Pilton's Tithe Barn is known and will be revealed at the meeting and old maps and pictures will be used to show the land and buildings associated with the system of tithes.

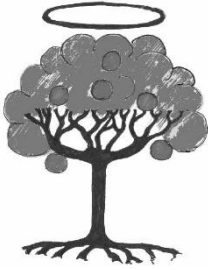
Three Pilton publications, as fundraisers for different aspects of the village, will continue on sale at the New Room Coffee Shop (or directly from Jenny on 890465).

PILTON'S COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH DURING 2023

During the last year Pilton Community Speedwatch have monitored over 21,000 vehicles passing through Pilton. Nearly 600 vehicles were recorded as speeding and their details passed to Avon and Somerset Police so that they could be sent their warning letter. Those who are recorded speeding through the village three times receive a visit from a police officer. Prosecutions do not follow from CSW notifications. However, the Police Speed Enforcement Unit (S.E.U) are regularly in Pilton because of the high levels of speeding on the A361.

We have made significant progress with reducing the dangerous speeding at the Neat Lane, A361, B3136 junction. This has been because of the combined activities of the C.S.W, the S.E.U, and the Speed Indicating Device (S.I.D) generously provided by Glastonbury Festival Events Ltd for much of the year.

East Compton residents have requested a CSW monitoring site in their area, but we are specifically forbidden to be active in a 60 mph zone for safety reasons. If you fancy joining us, you would be most welcome. There is initial training to do on line before you are authorised. We look forward to a busy 2024.
