

LISTENING - A CHALLENGE

Everyone likes to be listened to, however old or young we are. We rely on family and friends to listen to us when we are taking part in ordinary conversation and especially when we are anxious about ourselves or about someone for whom we care.

Cesca Priestley is the Diocesan Growing Faith Adviser; she responds to some questions for reasons for the importance of listening to young people.

"Why do young people sometimes feel that they are not listened to? Young people often feel things are decided for them, or they are not included in discussions about things set up for them.

How can we listen to young people more effectively?

Carving out time is the most important thing. Give them the opportunity to be involved. Meet them where they are and think of a couple of simple questions that are relevant to something you would like their input on.

Why is it important that we hear from young people? We need to value and listen to what they say which often brings new ideas that everyone can share."

The Bishop of Bath and Wells, the Rt Revd Michael Beasley, is offering the challenge to churches to listen to young people and develop the involvement of young people in church life.

That challenge may not apply to everyone reading these magazines but listening does. How can we take up the challenge to listen to the people in our lives and on the fringes of them?

CROSCOMBE WAR DEAD

When I first arrived in the village and walked up the steps to St Mary's, I came across the Commonwealth War Graves Commission plaque that indicated there were four CWGC graves in the churchyard. Then I noticed the two war memorial plagues in the church itself, together with the wonderful handwritten list of those who had given their lives in the service of their country from 1914-1918. We rightly remember all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice but for many of us that is remembering a name only, or a name with a regiment or service number. The result is a 24 page colour magazine which has a brief summary of each person together with images of original documents. Whilst I have received copyright permission from the various archive organisations to use their images I could only use them if the end product was not being sold. That rather ruled out the costs of a print run, so saving the magazine as a pdf seemed the best way forward. If anyone is interested and would like a copy sent as an email attachment just let me know via my email and I can send one through. If you do not have internet but know someone who does then I can easily send it through to them instead if that helps.

CROSCOMBE FLOOD AND ENVIRONMENT WORKING GROUP Update

Following the two floods in Croscombe in January and February this year we have been busy looking at ways we can mitigate the risk of similar disastrous floods in the future.

There was a very productive meeting with James Heappey and representatives from Somerset Council, the Environment Agency, Highways Agency, Wessex Water and the Somerset Rivers Authority. This has helped get our message across that something really needs to be done and soon. To that end the culverts in Croscombe including the long one opposite the old shop are in the process of being surveyed to see if they are damaged, silted up or just too small and Somerset Council has committed to produce a formal 'Section 19' report to review the floods this year. The Environment Agency has also visited people affected by the floods to advise on grants and property level flood protection measures they can take.

We have had a great response to our request for more flood wardens and the Environment Agency is also working on improving the monitoring and alerting of river levels.

Going forward the group is focusing on liaising with the main agencies, having an effective flood plan, trained flood wardens, and a co-ordinated strategy for lobbying and local actions. We are also looking to make a list of Flood Friends. Flood friends would be contacted after a flood to help with the clean-up. Many people helped in January and February. Our primary aim is to get action as soon as possible, with the effects of climate change the risk of further floods is increasing and we need to be ready.
