THE GIFT OF PRAYER

It is a great joy and privilege to come and join you here in Bath and Wells as the new Dean of Wells, to serve the Cathedral, the diocese and the county. This is an area with strong links on my maternal side, with my grandparents being married in Bath, and many relatives from around this patch.

One of the many things which drew me to this role is the privilege of prayer in your beautiful Cathedral Church. Each morning we gather and pray for the life of the diocese, and give thanks for that same life in the evening. Please be assured of my prayers for you in your mission and ministry and I warmly look forward to getting out to explore the diocese.

As I reflect on this time of change, I am mindful of the importance of finding patterns of prayer to sustain our lives, and nourish our spiritual growth. As Archbishop Desmond Tutu said many years ago, we must 'think of prayer as a relationship.' We are to invest in it, and to find space so that it can develop, and this takes time. Or as the mystic Evelyn Underhill put it, 'On every level of life, from housework to heights of prayer, in all judgement and efforts to get things done, hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur.'

We all know the importance of taking time to invest in relationships, and I love the challenge that hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur. As we reflect on our own prayer lives, I wonder if there are ways that we can deepen our relationship in prayer? The Christian tradition is packed with ways to help people learn to pray. Maybe we can find ways to slow ourselves down and be more present to the gift of prayer, so that we may join in the Apostle Paul's prayer, 'we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding'. (Colossians 1.9)



Very simple task, can be done in as little as 5 mins, most volunteers do 2-4 sessions per month. Full training given.



PILTON VILLAGE HISTORY GROUP

We look forward to welcoming Allen Cotton on Monday 10th June at 7.30pm in Pilton Village Hall for his illustrated talk titled "**Somerset Farming since the 1930s**".

Allen Cotton was born in 1933 in West Bradley into a long-established local farming family. In due course he took over the family farm, parts of which had been in his father's family since 1805, and other parts in that of his mother since the late 1850s. He and his wife Mary continued to develop the pedigree herd of Friesian cattle, started by his father in 1933. Allen also took an active part in various farm-connected local organisations including the Somerset Friesian Breeders club and the Somerset Branch of National Milk Records together with over 40 years as a volunteer at the Royal Bath & West Society.

After his son, David, took over managing the farm, he managed the commercial orchards at West Bradley, as well as serving on the County Council for 12 years. In 2013 he was presented with an O.B.E. for his "Services to Agriculture and the Community in Somerset".

PILTON RESIDENTS

- **Vehicle Passes** – Village Vehicle Passes and your tickets will be available from Pilton Village Hall on Saturday 15th June between 1pm and 6pm and again on Friday 21st June between 6pm & 8pm. As you will now be aware Pilton Village access passes and the Green Car Park Passes had to be pre-ordered online. No additional passes for Pilton access or Green Car Park will be available at these sessions.
- **Cockmill Lane** – Again this year, to improve safety for Cockmill Lane residents and pedestrians, a Temporary One-way Order will be in place in Cockmill Lane from Orchard Gate to Pylle Road (north bound). There will be no through traffic from the direction of Pylle Road (Pilton).
- **Security** – Security levels will be the same as last Festival.
- **Checkpoints** – The checkpoints will also be in the same places as the last Festival and will be operational from Saturday 22nd June to Monday 1st July. Full details of checkpoints, road closures and one-way systems will be available at the Vehicle Passes Distribution sessions.
- **Hot Line Number – 01749 899631** — is again operational all year. From 3rd June this number will put you straight through to the Festival Office on site, during office hours, and they will be able to deal with any urgent ongoing problems. This will be manned 24 hours a day during the actual Festival period. It is manned by dedicated staff in the Event Control Centre so they will have good access to all the relevant bodies, and this will give you a better service.
- **Drop-in Centre** – There will still be a member of GFL security based at Pilton Village Hall between 0800 and 2300 (26th -30th June) and 08.00 – 20.00 (1st July) who will have a direct link to the hotline team in the Event Control Centre.

The Village Team will be available at the vehicle passes distribution sessions should you wish to speak with us about any problems or concerns you may have, or you can contact us as below.

The quickest way to get Somerset to action issues with the roads, such as potholes, is by reporting it yourself via:

When reporting, you can upload a photo of the issue and locate it via the map, or, even better, use What3words, which will locate it to within 3ft. Somerset usually react fairly quickly.

PILTON JUMBLE TRAIL - BHOPAL MEDICAL APPEAL

Many thanks to all who came along to our stall and bought things, supported, donated items or money, resulting in raising a record sum that will go a long way to help those still affected by the appalling Indian gas disaster of nearly 40 years ago.
